Animal Population Control Program (APCP)

Thank you for choosing People for Animals and your interest in the APCP program! **Funding is allocated quarterly. Please submit your application for the next available quarter AS SOON AS POSSIBLE — spots are limited, and approval is not guaranteed. If approved, you will receive an email with your appointment date.**

1. Complete the APCP application. **Leave “Signature of Veterinarian” blank; section will be completed by a PFA surgeon.** Return your completed application with these additional items that we need from you so that you will be eligible for the program:
 - A valid copy of your identification (*license or passport*)
 - A copy of proof of your government aid (*whichever item you check for question #6 on the form*).
2. All names **must** match on all documents, including your license/passport.
3. **If you are using a Proxy form:** The owner **must** sign their Proxy form. Owner can leave Proxy information blank if you are not yet sure who will be dropping off the pet.

4. **If you are using a Shelter Program:** submit a signed adoption agreement and a copy of the dog's license. Ensure the license is up-to-date. Your dog **must** be licensed if you are using the shelter option.
- To get licensed, your dog needs to have an up-to-date Rabies shot. If your dog needs one, you can bring them to our clinic during Vaccine & Preventative Service hours:
 - a) Hillside: Tues/Thurs 10am-1pm, Wed 10am-4pm, Fri 9am-1pm, and Sat 9am-12pm.
 - b) Robbinsville: Tues/Thurs/Fri 10am-4pm, and Wed 10am-2pm.
 - c) Millville: Mon/Tues/Wed/Fri 9am-2pm
 - The Rabies vaccine is \$25 at our clinics. Once your dog has an up-to-date Rabies shot, you can bring the Rabies certificate (*you will get one when the dog receives the vaccine*) to your Town Hall and have him licensed. We need a copy of the license paperwork.

Once documents are received, application will be considered for next available quarter. Appointments made outside of APCP application process will not be covered by APCP.

Animal Population Control Program (APCP) State Guidelines

The New Jersey Department of Health supports several animal population control programs to prevent animal overpopulation and to protect human health. These include programs that promote the neutering of animals.

Low Cost Spaying/Neutering Program

You may be eligible to have your pet spayed or neutered at a discounted price at one of the participating veterinary hospitals.

Spay or Neuter your adopted dog or cat for \$20.00 if you:

- Are a New Jersey Resident
- Adopted your pet from an eligible licensed NJ shelter; municipal, county, or regional pound; NJ holding or impoundment facility that contracts with NJ municipalities; or a non-profit NJ animal adoption referral agency
- Licensed the dog in your municipality (licensing for cats is not required).

Spay or Neuter your dog or cat for \$10.00 if you receive any of the following:

- Food Stamps
- Medicaid
- General Public Assistance
- Rental Assistance
- Aid to Families with Dependent Children
- Lifeline Utility Credit
- Tenants Lifeline Assistance
- Supplemental Security Income – not the same as Social Security
- Pharmaceutical Assistance to Aged & Disabled

Provide complete application & proof of qualification to clinic where you would like to schedule appointment.
